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Revised TTGUC Covid Cleaning procedure

Instructions for cleaning-teams

It is hoped the cleaning-teams will be those rostered on for cleaning, plus other volunteers

Use hand sanitiser before putting on gloves and masks. Repeat sanitiser after removing.

Important: avoid touching your face, especially their mouth, nose and eyes when cleaning.

- Spray bottles with a **green label** have a diluted disinfectant mix in them.
- Spray ‘touch-points’, such as door handles, push plates, counters, table tops, backs of pews etc.
- Wipe over with disposable paper towels or cloths.
- Toilets areas will need special attention with taps, door handles, sink, cisterns, toilet paper and paper towel dispensers etc.
- Dispose of towels etc in the bin provided.
- Disposable gloves, face masks and hand sanitiser are provided in the foyer (near prayer room).

Floors will be washed and vacuumed during normal weekly cleaning and only need extra cleaning, if visibly dirty.

COVID Procedures

Sanctuary space can allow 125 people at 2 sq m spacing

However, ‘seating area’ will only accommodate 80 single people, more if couples/families

Hall will allow 84 people; Kingdom Kids 28; Foyer 32; Naomi Room 14

- Hand sanitising will be provided
- Encourage people to observe “If you are not well, please don’t attend”
- 1.5m social distancing will be managed. Seating has been rearranged to accommodate.
- Sign-in is required. This will be done electronically.
- Singing will be allowed. Everyone is to be mindful of each other’s ‘space’
- No cuppa after the service
- Encourage people to head home and not mingle

Playgroup and Children's Ministry Covid - 19 Safe Plan

Our room capacity for the Hall is **84 people** and Kingdom Kids room is **28 people**.

So there is plenty of space for everyone.

The playground will be available if weather permits.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * One parent/caregiver will sign in their children via the playground entrance, hand sanitizer will be available. * Parents/Caregivers will then proceed to the foyer for sign in. * Children will be provided with their own individual/ personalised pencil case, containing all the materials they will need for the session. This will be reused by the same child each week. * Morning tea will be provided by a leader with gloved hands on individual/labelled plates/cups. * Extensive cleaning will occur after each session (see Cleaning Checklist). * Worship time (singing) will be determined by CC decision. * Stay away from Kingdom Kids if your child/ren or any member of your family is unwell. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * One parent/caregiver will sign in themselves and their child/ren. A sign in table will be set up at the hall entrance door with hand sanitiser available. * Parents/caregivers must physically distance themselves from other people, therefore abiding by the 1.5m rule. * Playgroup will still run for 2 hours (9.30am - 11.30am) and include playtime, snack/lunch, story and singing. Limited craft activities will be available. * A limited amount of toys will be provided (no playdough/sensory play, soft toys and dress ups will be available). * Snack/lunch time will occur in family groups with physical distancing in place, the use of the hall will be available if Kingdom Kids room is at/near capacity. * Story and singing time will occur in the hall to allow for adequate space for everyone. * Coffee/tea is available however you will need to make your own and wash up your cup/utensils after use. * Please BYO snacks/lunch for your child/ren but please no sharing. * Stay away from playgroup if you or your children are feeling unwell. * Cash payments will no longer be accepted. * Extensive cleaning will occur after each playgroup session (see Cleaning Checklist) * Sign in register will be sent to Playgroup SA after each session.
